

## Forward-facing Car Seats

### Forward-facing Convertible Seat

- Convertible seats can face backward or forward
- Use forward-facing and upright when child outgrows the rear-facing weight limits of the seat
- Harness straps should be snug, with no slack
- Harness straps should be through reinforced slots, at or above shoulders
- Chest clip should be at armpit level
- Do not dress child in thick clothing
- Be sure to use forward-facing belt path for seat belt or LATCH
- Seat should be installed snugly so that it does not move side-to-side or forward more than 1 inch



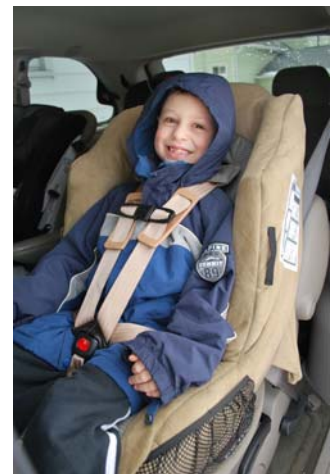
### Combination Seat

- Face forward only and are a combination of car seat and booster
- Use harness until child outgrows the harness weight or height limit
- Harness straps should be snug, with no slack
- Harness straps should be through slots at, or above shoulders
- Chest clip should be at armpit level
- Do not dress child in thick clothing
- Seat should be installed snugly so that it does not move side-to-side or forward more than 1 inch
- When the child outgrows the harness, use as a belt-positioning booster with the adult lap and shoulder belt



### Forward-facing Only Seat

- Face forward only and cannot be used in any other mode
- Harness straps should be snug, with no slack
- Harness straps should be through slots at, or above shoulders
- Chest clip should be at armpit level
- Do not dress child in thick clothing
- Seat should be installed snugly so that it does not move side-to-side or forward more than 1 inch
- Some seats have a higher weight limit on the harness for larger kids
